Mark – TeenTV Reporter

Today we're talking to famous Cosplayers from Hong Kong and overseas.

Hi Sarah. You're a Cosplayer, dressed as Sea Star from the Japanese Manga Ocean Wide. How and when did you start cosplaying?

Sarah -Cosplayer Hi Mark. I started in secondary school. I joined the Cosplay Club in Form 2. It was so much fun and it continued in my university years. Now I make a living cosplaying.

Mark – TeenTV Reporter What? You can earn money by doing Cosplay? I didn't know that!

Sarah -Cosplayer Oh yes, it pays a lot now. That also means the pressure is on – your costume has to be perfect.

Mark – TeenTV Reporter Really, why is that?

Sarah -Cosplayer The fans and judges expect the best. Anything less and they start blogging and using social media to complain. They will say that you didn't have the hair right, or the colour of the dress was wrong. It is serious stuff!

Mark – TeenTV Reporter Wow, I didn't realise.

Sarah -Cosplayer Yes, attention to detail is a must if you want to win.

Mark – TeenTV Reporter What does Cosplay mean, Sarah?

Sarah -Cosplayer The name Cosplay was coined in 1974 by a Japanese writer. It's a combination of two words – costume and play.

Mark – TeenTV Reporter So, if I want to cosplay, can I pick any character or are there certain characters you can choose from?

Sarah -Cosplayer The characters usually come from Japanese Manga, like my favourite Sea Star. Now some people dress up like their favourite cartoon characters, while others dress up as popular characters from their favourite online games or movies.
