SAKURA OR CHERRY BLOSSOM

Cherry blossom time runs from early March to the end of April. This time of year is very popular with both locals and visitors.

Springtime in Japan is full of images of trees awash with pink blossoms.

Why are they so popular?

The cherry blossoms are painted, written about in poems and photographed. The flowers are also a symbol of new beginnings.



Before the start of the season, there is a countdown called the Cherry Blossom Forecast. It can be seen daily on television and shows the blooming of the blossoms as they sweep from the south to the north. Since 1951, scientists have been tracking the blossoms as they bloom. Today it is very hi-tech with scientists using mathematical equations to forecast the blooming of the sakura.

RAMEN

Ramen spread from China to Japan. They are thin egg noodles served in a hot broth, flavoured with miso. Ramen are usually topped with slices of roast pork, bean sprouts, sweetcorn and butter.

The noodles...

are made from egg, wheat flour, water, salt water and salt. Noodles are judged



on their thickness, the percentage of water used to make them, the degree of wave, shape and their colour.

The soup...

is a key factor. It is usually made with salt, soy sauce and miso. To finish the broth, pork bone broth or chicken bone broth is added as well as a soup which may include sardines, other seafood or vegetable ingredients.

SUMO WRESTLING...


is a professional sport in Japan. It is also a way of life. The wrestlers fight in a ring called a dohyo. They also wear a special hair style called an oichomage. The sport appeals to many foreigners because it is <u>exotic</u>. Many have tried to break into the ranks but few succeeded until recent years. The language factor has made it difficult, as has the way of life of the sumo wrestler.





Christmas






O-Bon
