Impact of Typhoons on Hong Kong



Storm Surge

One danger with any typhoon is the storm <u>surge</u>. Storm <u>surge</u> is just a way of saying the sea level will rise due to the winds and low pressure of the typhoon. The height of the storm <u>surge</u> depends on the water depth and the shape of the coastline. The storm <u>surge</u> for the latest typhoon to hit Hong Kong, Mangkhut, was <u>record-breaking</u>! It was the highest recorded since <u>1979</u>.




Climate Crisis continued...

The Great Pacific Garbage Patch (GPGP)

This is an area in the Pacific Ocean between Hawaii and California.

Researchers have spent three years searching for floating waste. They found and collected bottle caps, fishing nets, toys and old containers.


It is estimated that the GPGP is made up of 80,000 tonnes of rubbish. That is equal to 500 jumbo jets or 250 pieces of rubbish for every person on the planet. What makes this worse is that there are four other garbage patches around the world where rubbish has also collected.




Garbage patches around the world EG Report

He broke all the beds in our bedrooms. He even demolished a door. He cracked all the walls in the stairways and halls, and he left several holes in the floor.


And when he was done causing damage, although we all wanted to scream, he said, "That was fun but I really must run. I hope you enjoy the ice cream."




The Chinese Dragon...

The Phoenix...


is known as the bird that rises from the ashes.

Depending on the reports, the bird ranges from the size of an eagle to being as big as an ostrich.









The Unicorn...
