Other Assessment Resources Originally Designed for TSA 2020

Narrator	The English Club is organising an English Speaking Day. To prepare for the English Speaking Day, the teacher-in-charge has given you a recording of the English Club meeting to listen to.
	Listen to the recording and answer the questions in <u>Part A</u> and <u>Part B</u> . The recording will be played <u>twice</u> . Do as much as you can the first time and answer all questions the second time. You now have 30 seconds to read the questions in <u>Part A</u> and <u>Part B</u> . (<i>music 30 secs.</i>)
	The listening will begin now.
[Phillip – Student	Hi Kitty. We have to plan the first English Speaking Day for the school year, so we should make it as interesting as possible. It has to be successful!
Kitty - Student	Yes, I agree, Phillip. I asked our members to give me their suggestions for the kinds of activities that students would find interesting. Shall we go through them one by one and make a list?
Phillip – Student	Sure, why not? We will need at least six activities, if not more, for the day. We have to run four before lunch and two after lunch.
Kitty - Student	Well, I only have two at the moment, so we may have to come up with some more.
Phillip – Student	(surprised) Only two! I thought you asked the members for ideas.
Kitty - Student	I did. Some still have to give me their suggestions.
Phillip – Student	So, we will need to have another meeting. That means we'll have four meetings in total, instead of three!
Kitty - Student	Yes. Now do you want to hear the suggestions or not?
Phillip – Student	(annoyed) Fine!
Kitty - Student	OK, first idea. Mary suggested we teach students how to make bookmarks. She told me we'll only need some thick paper and ribbon. The instructions are easy enough to follow in English.
Phillip – Student	Ribbon? For a bookmark? Why?

- **Kitty Student** (*angry*) **Phillip** don't tell me you don't know what a bookmark looks like! You cut your paper into a rectangle or shape that you like and decorate it with coloured pens and glitter.
- **Phillip Student** *(groan)* We don't have the money to buy glitter and coloured pens. We spent all of the money buying the prizes for the singing competition. We haven't been given our new budget yet.
- Kitty StudentWell, maybe you need to talk to Mr. Chan about getting our money.Anyway, I didn't say anything about buying pens.
- **Phillip Student** Urgh, another job to do. There are days I really hate being the head of the English Club!
- **Kitty Student** Let's get back to the activity. Mary said that the students have their own pens and they can also share them. Besides, we can also ask Ms. Leung if the Art Department has some materials that we can use.
- **Phillip Student** OK, that sounds good. So, why do we need the ribbon?
- **Kitty Student** *(exasperated)* Phillip! Think about what a bookmark looks like! The ribbon stops the bookmark from sliding around in your book.
- Phillip Student Oh, yeah. Sorry, I was just thinking about when I can see Mr. Chan.
- **Kitty Student** No problem. The good thing is that bookmarks don't take long to make.
- **Phillip Student** OK, activity number one bookmarks. So, what are the other suggestions from the members? Anything that won't cost any money and that's also fast to make?
- **Kitty Student** Yes, there's a really easy one which is also environmentally friendly. Kelly suggested it.
- **Phillip Student** This sounds good.
- **Kitty Student** It is! It's the plastic bag container. I think it's a great idea because it's made from things everyone has at home.
- **Phillip Student** Mm... I see, so what do I have at home that could become a plastic bag container?
- **Kitty Student** What students need is a large, empty tissue box. Oh, and of course, plastic bags to put inside! The tissue box already has the hole in the top and you can easily fold your plastic bags to fit and pull them out as you need them.
- **Phillip Student** I think that's a great idea because it's easy to find the materials and it's useful as well! (*fade out*)]
- Narrator Now listen to the conversation again. {*Repeat* []}
