Narrator

You have been asked to write a story about being late for school and what happens. Your English teacher has found a recording for you to listen to.

Listen to the conversation and the poem and answer the questions. The poem will be read <u>twice</u>. Do as much as you can the first time and answer all questions the second time. You now have 30 seconds to read the questions. (music 30 secs.)

The listening will begin now.

Mary – Student Simon, have you ever been late for school?

Simon – Student No, Mary, never! It's pretty hard to be late when you live right next to the school and it only takes five minutes to walk to the front gate!

Mary – Student You're so lucky! I have to get up at 6.30 in the morning just to get to school on time!

Simon – Student (*surprised*) What? 6.30 in the morning? Wow, I'm still asleep at that time. My mum usually wakes me up when she leaves the house at around 7.15 a.m.

Mary – Student You're lucky! I have an alarm that goes off at 6.00 a.m. and then it goes off again at 6.30 a.m.

I don't want to get up in the mornings, so my alarm is the only way I make sure I am ready and get to school on time.

Simon – Student I still can't believe you get up that early. Have you ever got to school late?
