There is a shopping area with many shops. @[In addition to being a rural area with beautiful scenery, the views of the South China Sea, especially from the mountain top, are really breathtaking.]@
- David: That's really interesting. By the way, we have to stop here for the commercial break. We'll be right back and Betty will tell us more about Cheung Chau.

- David: Welcome back. I'm David Wong. Before the break, we were talking to Betty Lo, our guest, about **some interesting things** on Cheung Chau. Could you tell us more about the Bun Festival on the island? How did the Bun Festival start?
- Betty: More than <u>a hundred</u> years ago, many people on Cheung Chau died of a serious <u>illness</u> that was spreading quickly.
- David: What was the cause?
- Betty: The people believed that it was evil spirits causing the <u>illness</u>. The <u>Northern King</u> killed the spirits and stopped the illness. <u>Since then</u> a big festival, called the Bun Festival, is held every year.
- David: I see. That's why the people on the island built the 'Temple of the Northern King'.
- Betty: That's right. It's also called 'Pak Tai Temple'.
