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

Climbing for Buns Again

The bun tower is 60 feet\* high. The buns attached to the tower are sweet and receive a blessing from monks. In the old days, people climbed up the bun towers at midnight and collected buns. They believed that the higher they climbed, the better luck they would have for the coming year. In 1978, many people were seriously injured climbing the bun towers which were built on bamboo frames. The climbing of the bun towers was then banned. However, the government revived the event in 2005 with a \$570,000 steel tower at the Pak Tai Temple Playground and held a 'bun-scrambling competition'. Whoever grabbed the most buns won a grand prize.

Remark: \* The traditional type of bun tower is 60 feet high while the present steel tower is 46 feet high.
