



Please return the draft to me as soon as possible.




(A) Jubilee Nature Park Activity Schedule

Tom is a member of the Reading Club. He is reading about the writer of a book called 'Treasure Island'.

Read the following passage.

Treasure Island is a very famous book for children written by Robert Louis Stevenson. It is a wonderful memorial to this talented writer.

Stevenson was born in Scotland in 1850. At the age of 17, he took a course in engineering. His father hoped that he would be his successor one day. However, he dropped the course and studied law instead. Contrary to what his parents 5 expected, Stevenson never worked as either an engineer or a lawyer. He knew that he really wanted to be a writer.

Stevenson travelled to many places in his twenties. One of his first published books, *An Inland Voyage*, was about travel. He loved France most and lived there with other young artists, writers and painters. In 1876, he met his future 10 wife there. Fanny was an American lady, eleven years older than him, married with two children. She divorced her husband to marry Stevenson two years later.

Stevenson began to write *Treasure Island* for his 12-year-old stepson, which was then published in 1883. This popular book was Stevenson's first book 15 which made him a lot of money. After this successful book, he wrote books both for children and adults.

In 1888, Stevenson decided to sail around the Pacific islands with his family. The following year they settled in Samoa, an island in the beautiful South Pacific. Stevenson loved living there and wrote about the island and the ocean 20 in many of his later works. He always wanted things his way and even planned his own burial. When he died in 1894, he was buried on a mountain, as he wanted, above his home on Samoa. On his tomb are the lines he requested written from his own poem *Requiem*:

'Under the wide and starry sky, 25 Dig the grave and let me lie...'
