Miss Wong: Just reading each paragraph slowly may not help you read better. I have

some suggestions that will make reading easier for you. Before you start reading, you can use the information on the book cover and the table of contents to help you guess what the book is about. When you read, you can work out the meaning of unknown words by looking at pictures for clues. You can also use the words that you know to help you guess the meaning of some unknown words. For example, if you know the word 'care', you

can guess the meaning of 'careless'.

Michael: I see, Miss Wong. That's good advice. Thanks.

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Narrator: Question 5: How could Michael read better? (beep)(8-second pause)

Question 6: Michael thinks Miss Wong is ______. (beep)(8-

second pause)

Miss Wong: I think you also need more exposure to English. You must read more, not

only for school but for enjoyment as well. You can read a variety of texts such as short stories, comics, newspapers and teenage magazines. You can watch more English television shows and listen to more English radio programmes. All this will definitely help you increase your vocabulary and

you will enjoy English more.

Michael: All of these things will take a lot of time. But I'll try them if they'll help

me read better. Thanks, Miss Wong.
