[Interviewer: Welcome to Radio 4! Tomorrow will be Hong Kong's first 'No Plastic Bag Day'. What is this event? And why is it important? To answer these questions, we have David Tam, Chairperson of the Green Earth Society. Good morning, David, and welcome.

David: Thank you for having me. 5

Interviewer: 'No Plastic Bag Day' is the latest project of your organisation, Green Earth. Please tell us more about the purpose of this project.

David: Well, the purpose behind 'No Plastic Bag Day' is to reduce the number of plastic bags that people use. We use far too many of them so we are hoping, for at least one day, everyone will try not to use any plastic bags.

Interviewer: Well, I must admit, I see people using a lot of plastic bags.

David: $\quad\{\underline{\text { know. Why do they have to use so many bags? Do you know that }}$ on average almost 33 million plastic bags are used in Hong Kong every single day? \} (1) That's to say, every person in Hong Kong uses at least five bags a day.

Interviewer: $\quad\{$ Five bags per person every single day? That's unbelievable! \} (2)

David: It's true! Just look at the way people use plastic bags - they take as
many as they can and throw them out after using them only once. The problem is that these plastic bags fill up Hong Kong's landfills. There's just not enough landfill space.

Interviewer: What about the government? Do you think the government should make shops charge for plastic bags?

David: Well, Ireland and other countries make people pay for plastic bags. How about you? Would you mind paying for plastic bags?

Interviewer: Honestly, I wouldn't mind paying a small fee for every bag - it would certainly help me cut down on the number of plastic bags I use! Thank you, David. That's the end of our interview with David Tam. Thanks for joining us today!] (3 seconds pause)

David: \{I know. Why do they have to use so many bags? Do you know that on average almost 33 million plastic bags are used in Hong Kong every single day? \} (1) (2 seconds pause)

How does David feel? (beep) (5 seconds pause)
Question number 7 (line 17)
Interviewer: \{Five bags per person every single day? That's unbelievable! \} (2) (2 seconds pause)

How does the interviewer feel? (beep) ( 5 seconds pause)
