Today we will be bringing you reports from both the stands and the sporting arena.

Sporting arena? Can't you just call it the track and field?

(*impatiently*) Do you want me to do this, Silvia, or not? If you interrupt me, I'm just going to go and sit in the stands with the cheering teams and you can do this all by yourself!

Silvia – Producer of Campus TV programme

(worried sigh) I'm sorry Mark, but it's my first time as a producer. I want to do it right. I'm sure Mr. Wong won't let me do this again if I don't do a good job!

Mark - Lead Reporter for Campus TV

Look Silvia, it will be ok, but stop interrupting me or we'll miss all of the excitement and the events. Point the camera down there. The opening ceremony is about to start!
