| | You now have 55 seconds to study Questions 1 to 11. (55-second music) |
| | Now, listen to the conversation. The conversation will be played <u>two times</u> . When you hear a beep (<i>beep</i>), answer the question. The conversation will begin now. |
| Cindy: | [Good afternoon, listeners. This is Cindy Lee. Welcome to 'The Lunchtime Show'. Today we're going to talk about environmental protection. Let's welcome today's guest, Mr Wong. Hi, Mr Wong. |
| Wong: | Hi, Cindy. |
| Cindy: | I think students in our school have worked very hard to protect the environment. Do you agree, Mr Wong? |
| Wong: | Our students have done some things. But they haven't done enough. They should do more. |

| Wong: | I'll give you an example. In our school, there are some recycling bins. But most students don't use them. They throw all their paper and bottles in rubbish bins, not the recycling bins. They can do better than that. |
| Narrator: | Question 3: Mr Wong wants the students to (beep)(8-second pause) |
| Cindy: | Why is it important to protect the environment? |
| Wong: | Because if we don't, pollution will get worse. Do you like breathing in dirty air? Or do you want to see clear, blue skies? |
| Cindy: | Blue skies, of course. That's why our school is holding an event called Green Day, right? |

| Wong: | There'll be a talk. Ms Ella Wallace from Green World will give a speech. She'll tell us about pollution in Hong Kong and Mainland China. She'll also teach us some simple things we can do to save our environment. |
