Narrator	Your school is participating in the District Education Fair. To prepare for the fair, your teacher has given you the flyer from last year to read and last year's Campus Radio recording from the Education Fair for you to listen to.
	Read the <u>flyer</u> and listen to the <u>recording</u> . Answer the questions in <u>Part</u> <u>A</u> and <u>Part B</u> . You now have 2 minutes to answer the questions in <u>Part</u> <u>A</u> and read the questions in <u>Part B</u> . (music 2 mins.)
	Listen to the recording. It will be played <u>twice</u> . Do as much as you can the first time and answer all questions the second time. You now have 30 seconds to read the questions. (<i>music 30 secs.</i>)
	The listening will begin now.
[Ivan – Campus Radio Host	Good morning everyone. We are broadcasting from the Education Office where students and teachers are setting up the District Education Fair, which opens tomorrow. This is the first year of the fair. Let's talk to Mrs. Cheung who helped organise the fair.
Mrs. Cheung – Fair Organiser	Hello Ivan.
Ivan – Campus Radio Host	Hi Mrs. Cheung. You helped organise the fair. Can you tell me something about it and why it was started?
Mrs. Cheung – Fair Organiser	Sure. The idea of the fair came from a group of teachers in the district who wanted some way of bringing students together. They wanted them to see what students in other schools in the district were doing in different subjects. It could be anything from a display to an experiment, a film, a report or even a competition entry.
Ivan – Campus Radio Host	Oh I see, sort of like a big competition, but involving all subjects.
Mrs. Cheung – Fair Organiser	Yes, exactly, except that the fair isn't a competition. Usually students enter competitions their teachers tell them about or get them involved in. Win or lose, only their classmates see the efforts of their hard work. Teachers wanted to display the work at the fair so that the public could see it as well.
Ivan – Campus Radio Host	Do they have to be the winners of a competition to display their work?

Mrs. Cheung -No. Teachers and students decide if they want to exhibit. It doesn't Fair Organiser matter if they got first place or if they came last. It is a way for other people to see their work. Ivan – Campus How long is the fair? **Radio Host** The fair runs for a week at the Education Office. The exhibits are Mrs. Cheung – **Fair Organiser** getting set up today and will be removed one week later. Ivan – Campus Is there anything else that makes this fair different from other **Radio Host** education fairs? Mrs. Cheung – Good question. We know students cannot take a week off school to be at the fair to explain their projects or answer questions. That's why we **Fair Organiser** set up tablets at each display. If people want to ask questions they complete the online question form. Ivan – Campus Oh, really? How does that work? **Radio Host** Mrs. Cheung -Each group has a blog set up where the answers get posted. People can **Fair Organiser** get the answers to their questions when they log in to the fair website and follow the link to the various blogs. Ivan – Campus (excited tone) Wow, that's really modern and a great way of keeping the students connected to the fair, even if they have to be at school! It's **Radio Host** like getting instant feedback about the interest in your project. Yes, it is Ivan. We really had to think about how to keep students Mrs. Cheung – **Fair Organiser** connected to the fair during school time. We didn't want this to just be a very static display with no interaction from the students and teachers. Students and teachers can check the blog when they are at school and answer any questions that come in to their blog. Ivan – Campus That's really great, Mrs. Cheung. Thanks for talking to us. We'll take a **Radio Host** short break now...(fade out)] Narrator Now listen to the recording again. *{Repeat []}* Narrator You have 30 seconds to check your answers. (music 30 secs.)
