
Short BUT Interesting Tidbits continued...

Sales records were broken in the Asian art world yesterday. At the sales held by Smiths & Sapphire, a rare black and blue diamond <u>had everyone buzzing</u>.

The diamond is <u>unique</u> because it is uncut, very large and has a strange colouring.

It was sold to an Asian collector for HK\$700.9 million.


Uncut diamonds can be kept in one piece or cut into smaller pieces. If it is cut into pieces, it could make the collector even more money.

My parents weren't too happy when I told them of my <u>goal</u>. I found a half a dinosaur, but then they found the hole.


