Gigi: Yes. They are my favourite.

Miss Chan: Bobby, do you like that style of cafe?

Bobby: Yes, they are air-conditioned and provide many types of food, both

Chinese and Western.

Gigi: Cha chaan teng food is delicious. Their service is fast, just like Western

fast food restaurants, but some of them are very crowded.

Narrator: Now, answer Questions 1 and 2. (beep)(15-second pause)

Gigi & Bobby: No.

Gigi: I have many activities after school. So I'm very busy.
