

	Tommy and Aunt Lucy are talking about Mother's Day.
	Listen to what they say. The conversation will be played <u>two times</u> . When
	you hear a beep (beep), answer the questions.
	Now, study Questions 1 and 2. (10-second music)
	Listen to the first part of the conversation.
Aunt Lucy:	[Mother's Day is coming soon. Tommy, how will you celebrate with your mum?
Tommy:	I will draw a card for her. I may also get her a bunch of roses.
Aunt Lucy:	Good, your mum loves flowers. But I think flowers like carnations are
	better than roses. Carnations have the meaning of a mother's love.
Tommy:	I see. I'll go for carnations then.
Aunt Lucy:	What colour carnations would you like to buy? Pink, red or yellow?
Tommy:	Hmm How about white? It's Mum's favourite colour.

	Day.
