



Student Stress on the Rise



Several studies carried out recently have found that both primary and secondary students are overloaded with stress. This pressure or worry can have negative effects on students' health and their behaviour. What are the reasons for the stress? Students surveyed said that it was due to worries about academic results, other school-based issues like problems with teachers, interpersonal relationships or family finances. Look at the time students spent studying.

STUDY A: Overall Study Time for Students



So, you might wonder then if students are studying so much, how much sleep students get. Sleep is important for students. Not enough sleep can affect students negatively, resulting in health issues, like heart problems and mental issues. It can also cause behavioural problems and a decline in academic results.



So what do students do when they should be sleeping? Primary 4-6 students said that they played video games and watched television instead of sleeping. Secondary 1-3 students played video games, chatted with their friends or surfed the internet. Secondary 4-6 students did the same things the Secondary 1-3 students did but they also said that they spent some of their time studying.



Given the impact on the well-being of students, it is obvious that something has to be done. Students need to learn and study and they also need time to relax and enjoy themselves. Balancing all of these factors is important to reduce the stress students feel.




in his alien flying machine.




He broke down our door



1. Starts in the playground.


